Dangerous Love

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Chapter 1: Introduction – The Different Types of Love

Love is a powerful force, one that God created to bind us to one another and to Him. As humans, we naturally crave love in various forms—whether it’s the love we receive from our families, romantic love, or even the love from friends and community. Prophet Bonang, in his message, reminded us that there are several types of love:

- 1.The Love Every Human Deserves: As people created in God’s image, we all deserve a level of respect, dignity, and love simply because we are human.
- 2.Romantic Love: The special bond shared between partners in love, which can bring joy, companionship, and comfort.

However, Prophet Bonang also introduced us to another type of love—one that many may not have considered before. He called this love “dangerous love.”



Chapter 2: What is Dangerous Love?

Dangerous love is a love that can keep you in the wrong place. It is the kind of love that feels comfortable, warm, and secure but ultimately hinders your spiritual and personal growth. It's a love that comes from people who should hate you—people whose love keeps you stagnant instead of propelling you toward your God-given destiny.

Prophet Bonang used the story of Joseph to illustrate this point. If Joseph's brothers had loved him the way their father Jacob did, Joseph would have remained with them, comfortable and loved, but never promoted to fulfill his destiny. He would have stayed in a place of peace and comfort but ultimately starved spiritually.

Dangerous love is deceptive—it looks like care and affection, but it can hold you back from God's plan.



Joseph’s Story – The Hidden Blessing in Rejection

The story of Joseph from the Bible (Genesis 37–50) teaches us about the power of God’s divine plan working through difficult circumstances, including rejection and hatred. Joseph was his father Jacob’s favorite son, and Jacob showered him with love, symbolized by the coat of many colors. However, Joseph’s brothers despised him, sold him into slavery, and thought they had gotten rid of him for good.

At first glance, their hatred seemed like a curse. But Prophet Bonang explains that had Joseph’s brothers loved him the same way Jacob did, Joseph would have stayed with them in comfort. He would have never gone to Egypt, and he would have never been in a position to save his family and many others during the great famine.

Scripture Reference:

Genesis 50:20 – “You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives.” (NIV)

God used the rejection and hatred Joseph experienced to move him into his destiny. If Joseph had stayed in the dangerous love of his brothers, he would have missed out on God’s promotion.



Chapter 4: Stop Trying to Make Everyone Love You

One of the key messages Prophet Bonang emphasized was this: We often spend too much time trying to get people to love us, not realizing that their hatred or rejection is part of God's plan. We try to win their approval, thinking that if everyone loves us, life will be easier. But what if their love is actually keeping us in a place of spiritual starvation?

We must stop trying to convince people to love us when God may be using their actions to push us toward our destiny. Prophet Bonang reminded us that we shouldn't fight against the situations God has allowed. Sometimes, God is closing doors or allowing relationships to fall apart because He knows what lies ahead.



Chapter 5: God's Plan Behind the Rejection

As Christians, it's crucial to understand that nothing happens in our lives without God's knowledge or approval. Even when people reject us or mistreat us, God has a purpose behind it. Often, God uses these painful experiences to lead us into something greater. Rejection and hatred are sometimes the very tools God uses to remove us from places where we would become stagnant.

Scripture Reference:
Romans 8:28 – “And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.” (NIV)

Instead of resisting the process or trying to make people love us, we need to trust that God is working all things for our good, even when it doesn't feel like it. He knows why some people are made to hate you, and He allows it because He has a greater plan in mind.



Chapter 6: Embrace Your Path – Rejection as God’s Tool for Elevation

Embracing rejection as part of God’s plan requires faith. It means trusting that God knows what is best for you, even when it feels like you are being pushed out or left behind. Joseph embraced the path God laid out for him, and it led him to be promoted in Egypt, where he saved countless lives, including his own family.

As Christians, we must recognize that the path to our promotion may not always be smooth. It may involve discomfort, rejection, or even hatred. But through it all, God is working behind the scenes to elevate us and fulfill His purpose in our lives.

When you feel rejected, remember Joseph’s story. What others meant for evil, God can turn for your good.

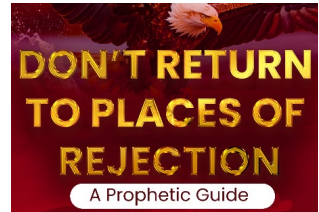
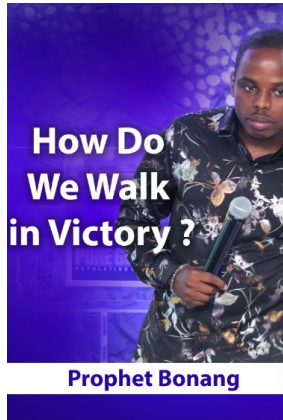
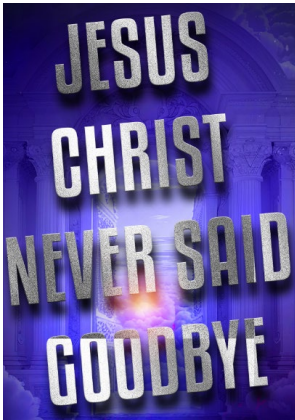
