


Prophet Bonang

Biblical Examples of Rejection:

- 1. Jesus Christ: Jesus, the Son of God, was rejected by His own people. In John 1:11, it is written, "He came to that which was His own, but His own did not receive Him" (NIV). Despite being the Messiah, Jesus faced rejection, but He did not let it deter Him from His mission.
- 2. The Apostle Paul: Paul faced numerous rejections throughout his ministry, from being persecuted by religious leaders to being abandoned by fellow believers. Yet, he remained steadfast in his calling, focusing on those who were receptive to the Gospel.
- 3. Prophet Samuel: When the Israelites rejected Samuel's leadership and demanded a king, Samuel felt personal rejection. But God reassured him in 1 Samuel 8:7, "It is not you they have rejected, but they have rejected me as their king" (NIV).

This conditional acceptance is not genuine love or fellowship, which is why we must be discerning about where we invest our time and emotional energy.

CHAPTER 2: THE SCRIPTURAL COMMAND TO SHAKE THE DUST OFF

Jesus' Instruction to His Disciples:

In Matthew 10:14, Jesus said, "If anyone will not welcome you or listen to your words, leave that home or town and shake the dust off your feet" (NIV). This act of shaking off the dust was a symbolic gesture indicating that the disciples were moving on from those who rejected the message of Christ. It represented leaving behind any negativity, offense, or rejection associated with that place.

The Spiritual Significance:

1.Leaving Rejection Behind: Shaking the dust off one's feet signifies a clean break from the past. It's a declaration that your peace, purpose, and identity are not tied to those who reject you.

2.Protecting Your Peace: When you choose to shake the dust off, you are protecting your heart and mind from being affected by rejection. You are declaring that your peace comes from God, not from the approval of others.

3.Moving Forward in Purpose: By following this command, you demonstrate your trust in God's guidance. You acknowledge that He has greater plans for you beyond the places of rejection, and you are willing to move forward in faith.



Chapter 3: Why You Should Not Return to Places of Rejection

EMOTIONAL AND SPIRITUAL TURMOIL.

1.Preserving Your Peace:

Rejection often brings emotional and spiritual turmoil. Constantly returning to places where you've been rejected can reopen wounds and disrupt your peace. Jesus is known as the Prince of Peace, and He desires for us to live in His peace. Protecting your peace is crucial for maintaining a strong relationship with God and others. 3. Focusing on the Future:

In Isaiah 43:18-19, God says, "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?" (NIV). Returning to places of rejection keeps you tied to the past, hindering your ability to embrace the new things God wants to do in your life. God's plan is always forward-looking, and He desires for you to press on toward the future He has prepared.



CHAPTER 4: PRACTICAL STEPS TO MOVING FORWARD

1. Accept the Reality of Rejection:

Understand that rejection is a part of life, even for believers. Accepting this reality helps you process it without taking it personally. Remember, even Jesus was rejected, yet He remained focused on His mission.

2. Shake the Dust Off Your Feet:

5. Continue to Serve Faithfully:

Do not allow rejection to deter you from serving God. Keep using your gifts, sharing the Gospel, and doing good works. Galatians 6:9 encourages us, "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up" (NIV).

Chapter 5: Finding Strength in God's Presence

perfecter of our faith" (NIV). Jesus is our perfect example of handling rejection with grace and continuing in God's purpose. Let His example inspire you to keep moving forward.
